# MAPPING THE MAZE: FINANCE AND INSURANCE RESOURCES

Blood and marrow transplants are expensive. There are many extra expenses after transplant too, especially if you do not live close to your transplant center. Because of these added expenses, if you are considering transplant, you also need to think about your insurance coverage and financial situation. It is important to understand your coverage and prepare for these expenses as soon as possible. Insurance and financial concerns can be frustrating, but knowing what resources are available can help you through the transplant process.

Be The Match<sup>®</sup> has financial aid programs to help:

- The Search Assistance Fund can help pay part of the cost to search the Be The Match Registry® of unrelated adult donors and cord blood units, if your insurance does not cover your search process. This assistance can allow your search process to begin as quickly as possible. Related Search Assistance funds are also available to help with the cost of testing your first degree relatives to see if they are a match, if your insurance does not cover this cost.
- The Transplant Support Assistance grant can help with some of the extra expenses, such as

copays and travel, after transplant. This grant is available during the first 12 months after transplant.

Your transplant center social worker will help you:

- Find financial aid available through Be The Match and other organizations
- Find out if you qualify for financial aid
- Complete the applications

The following pages contain general information about organizations and programs that may help you with your insurance or financial concerns. Use this as a starting point to help you find the assistance you need. As available funds change over time, it is best to contact each organization directly to verify availability and eligibility, and apply for assistance. Your transplant center or clinic social worker can help you locate other resources.
